- ▶ The appropriate representation of women in research, education and organizations concerned with Women's Mental Health
- ▶ Control by women of their personal fertility.

- ▶ The organization of World Congresses, to which all individuals, Societies and Sections concerned with Women's Mental Health are invited.
- ▶ The support of international, regional, national and local conferences and symposia, for Exchange of information about scientific advances,

- ▶ Circulation of information about Women's Mental Health, through the World Wide Web, through the Association's co-sponsored journal, Archives of Women's Mental Health, and other publications.

- ▶ Collaboration with advocacy groups.

- ▶ Basic sciences pertinent to gender difference and female biology.

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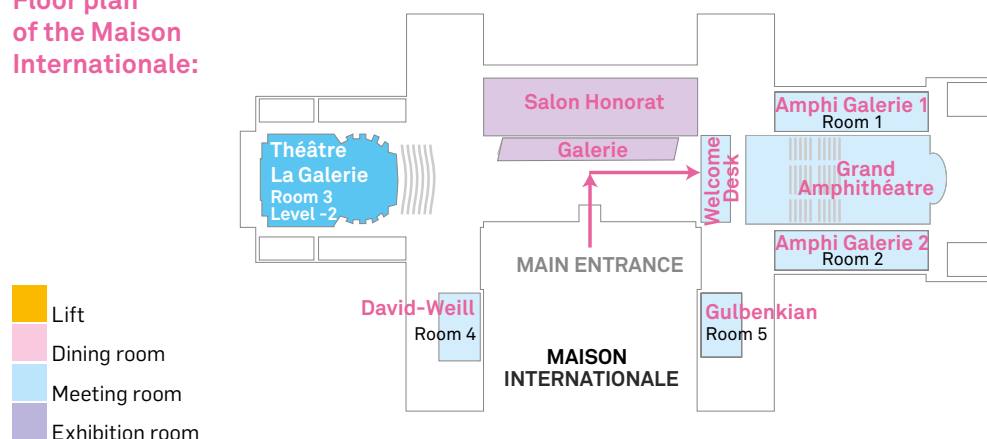

- ▶ In Paris, French and English are spoken.
- ▶ The currency is the euro (€)

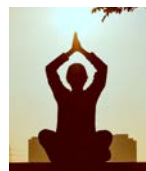

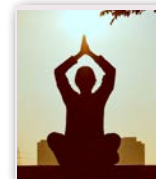

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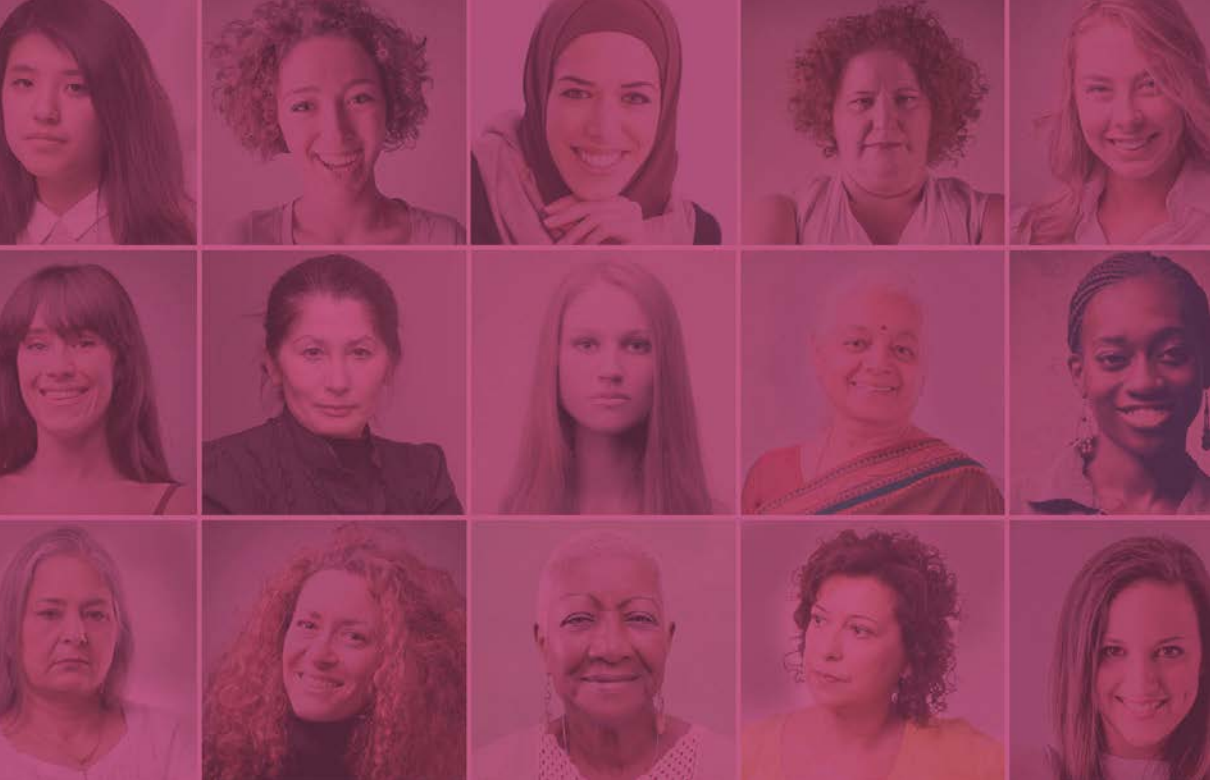
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
