New Findings in Alcohol Use Behaviors and Disorders: Gender and Brain-behavior Relationships

Alcohol use disorders constitute significant public health concerns globally, and subdiagnostic levels of consumption may be problematic (e.g., alcohol use during pregnancy). Women and girls may engage in alcohol consumption for different reasons than men and boys, with negative reinforcement mechanisms linked to escaping from troubling affective states and stress more prominent in females relative to males. This presentation will consider these gender-related differences and will present on brain responses to stress that differ in men and women and their relationships to addictive behaviors. Further, examinations of structural brain co-variation patterns linked to binge drinking, early onset of alcohol use and related risk factors (internalizing and externalizing psychopathology) will be presented from a gender-informed and neurodevelopmental perspective.
